



Author Guidelines

The International Review of Research in Management Finance and Governance is a scholarly journal specializing in the publication of academic work covering the fields of management, finance, and governance.

This guide provides suggestions on the format, form, and structure of a manuscript. The editorial team will, if necessary, revise the article to the appropriate format for potential publication after peer review.

Format and Formatting:

All manuscripts must be submitted in Word format with the following formatting:

- ✓ Margins: 2.5 cm on each side
- ✓ Justified paragraphs
- ✓ Single line spacing
- ✓ Font: Times New Roman
- ✓ Size: 12-point regular font for body text and 14-point bold for headings
- ✓ Line spacing: 1.5 points

All tables and figures must be numbered and titled (Figure 1: Title, Table 1: Title, etc.). The title of a table should appear above the figure, and the title of a figure below.

The style and presentation of bibliographic references must conform to the American Psychological Association (APA) style guidelines (7th edition).

Manuscript Submission:

Manuscripts should be submitted via the journal's platform or by email to the following address: editor@mfg-review.com

The editorial team carries out an initial review of the form of the manuscripts before launching the peer review process.



Instructions for successful publication:

The abstract must include a brief presentation of the research objectives, the methodological approach adopted, the results likely to be of interest to the public, and a conclusion.

- ✓ To facilitate indexing, the author must provide at least five keywords.
- ✓ Manuscripts must be original and adhere to a structure widely recognized by the scientific community. Authors should highlight the importance, originality, and rigor of their methodological approach to maximize impact.
- ✓ All essential elements for understanding the research and assessing the relevance of the results must appear in the body of the text or in an appendix.
- ✓ Review articles (or theoretical articles) must provide a broad and balanced overview of the literature in their research area.
- ✓ Empirical articles must include, among other things:
 - An introduction
 - A literature review and hypotheses
 - The research methodology adopted
 - The results and their discussion
 - A conclusion
